A minister of Holy Communion typically encounters three types of situation when taking Communion to the sick. The first is a regular visit to someone suffering from the effects of age, illness or infirmity. The second concerns a visit to someone who is dying. In this situation, the Church refers to the Holy Eucharist as Viaticum. This last word means "food for the journey," keeping in mind that death is a journey into the afterlife.
